Mr. SOUDER (for himself, Mr. ANDREWS, and Mr. MCINTOSH) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

A BILL

To establish a national clearinghouse for youth entrepreneurship education.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. NATIONAL CLEARINGHOUSE FOR YOUTH EN-**
4 **TREPRENEURSHIP EDUCATION.**

5 (a) PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary may
6 award a grant or contract to an organization or institution
7 with substantial experience in curriculum-based entrepre-
8 neurship education to establish a national clearinghouse
9 for youth entrepreneurship education. The purpose for the
10 clearinghouse shall be to facilitate professional develop-

1 ment opportunities for teachers, stimulate community
 2 partnerships with businesses, youth agencies, and non-
 3 profit entities (including faith-based, non-profit, and other
 4 local organizations), collect and disseminate curricular
 5 materials, and undertake other activities to encourage
 6 teacher interest and involvement in entrepreneurship edu-
 7 cation, especially for students in grades 7 through 12.

8 “(b) FUNDING.—There are authorized to be appro-
 9 priated to carry out this section \$500,000, for each of the
 10 fiscal years 2000, 2001, and 2002, of which \$500,000
 11 shall be made available from the Department of Edu-
 12 cation’s administrative budget.

13 **SEC. 2. USE OF FUNDS FROM OTHER PROGRAMS FOR**
 14 **YOUTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP.**

15 For the purposes of each of the following programs,
 16 curriculum-based youth entrepreneurship education pro-
 17 grams with demonstrated records of empowering dis-
 18 advantaged youth with applied math, entrepreneurial, and
 19 other analytical skills shall be considered to be an eligible
 20 use of funds provided under such program:

21 (1) subparts 1 and 2 of part D and part E of
 22 title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education
 23 Act of 1965;

24 (2) subparts 1, 2, and 4 of part A and part B
 25 of title III of such Act;

1 (3) subparts 1 and 2 of part A of title IV of
2 such Act;

3 (4) parts B and C of title VI of such Act; and

4 (5) part A and subparts 1 and 2 of part J of
5 title X of such Act.

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
