Mr. RADANOVICH introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Education and the Workforce

A BILL

To amend the Migrant and Seasonal Agricultural Worker
Protection Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FARM LABOR CONTRACTOR.**

4 Section 3(6) of the Migrant and Seasonal Agricul-
5 tural Worker Protection Act (29 U.S.C. 1802(6)) is
6 amended by inserting before the period the following:
7 “other than such a worker who voluntarily enters into car-
8 pool arrangements or who is directed or requested to do
9 so by a person pursuant to Federal, State, or local law”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONFIRMATION OF REGISTRATION.**

2 Section 402 of the Migrant and Seasonal Agricultural
3 Worker Protection Act (29 U.S.C. 1842) is amended by
4 striking “No person” and inserting “Except as provided
5 in subsection (b), no person” and by adding at the end
6 the following:

7 “(b) Where a person is a farm labor contractor solely
8 because such person, for any money or other valuable con-
9 sideration paid or promised to be paid, engages in trans-
10 porting any migrant or seasonal agricultural worker, an
11 agricultural employer or agricultural association employ-
12 ing such worker shall be required to take the reasonable
13 steps described in subsection (a) only where such employer
14 or association had actual knowledge that such transpor-
15 tation was not a carpooling arrangement among such
16 workers themselves.”.

17 **SEC. 3. MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY INSURANCE REQUIRE-**
18 **MENTS.**

19 Section 401(b)(3) of the Migrant and Seasonal Agri-
20 cultural Worker Protection Act (29 U.S.C. 1841(b)(3)) is
21 amended to read as follows:

22 “(3) The level of insurance required under paragraph
23 (1)(C) shall be determined by the applicable transpor-
24 tation requirements under State law.”.
