 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1SECTION 1. BAN ON THE PROVISION OF FEDERAL FUNDS2TO THE INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND3UNLESS IT PAYS REMUNERATION TO THE4UNITED STATES ON 100 PERCENT OF THE RE-5SERVE POSITION OF THE UNITED STATES IN6THE INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND.

7 No officer, employee, or agent of the United States 8 may provide or approve the provision of any resources to 9 the International Monetary Fund through gold sales, an increase in the quota of the United States in the Inter-10 national Monetary Fund, or any other means, unless the 11 Secretary of the Treasury, in consultation with the Comp-12 troller General, determines, at the time of such provision 13 14 or approval, that the International Monetary Fund pays remuneration to the United States on 100 percent of the 15 reserve position of the United States in the International 16 Monetary Fund. 17
