# H.R. 3166

To establish a commission to study the impact of deregulation of the airline industry on small town America.

### IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. Baldacci introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

## A BILL

To establish a commission to study the impact of deregulation of the airline industry on small town America.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. AIRLINE DEREGULATION STUDY COMMISSION.

(a) ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.—

(1) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established a commission to be known as the Airline Deregulation

Study Commission (in this section referred to as the "Commission").

(2) Membership.—

1	(A) Composition.—Subject to subpara-
2	graph (B), the Commission shall be composed
3	of 15 members of whom—
4	(i) 5 shall be appointed by the Presi-
5	dent;
6	(ii) 5 shall be appointed by the Presi-
7	dent pro tempore of the Senate, upon the
8	recommendation of the Majority and Mi-
9	nority leaders of the Senate; and
10	(iii) 5 shall be appointed by the
11	Speaker of the House of Representatives,
12	in consultation with the Minority leader of
13	the House of Representatives.
14	(B) Members from Rural Areas.—
15	(i) Requirement.—Of the individ-
16	uals appointed to the Commission under
17	subparagraph (A)—
18	(I) one of the individuals ap-
19	pointed under clause (i) of that sub-
20	paragraph shall be an individual who
21	resides in a rural area; and
22	(II) two of the individuals ap-
23	pointed under each of clauses (ii) and
24	(iii) of that subparagraph shall be in-
25	dividuals who reside in a rural area.

1	(ii) Geographic distribution.—
2	The appointment of individuals under sub-
3	paragraph (A) pursuant to the requirement
4	in clause (i) of this subparagraph shall, to
5	the maximum extent practicable, be made
6	so as to ensure that a variety of geographic
7	areas of the country are represented in the
8	membership of the Commission.
9	(C) Date.—The appointments of the
10	members of the Commission shall be made not
11	later than 60 days after the date of the enact-
12	ment of this Act.
13	(3) Period of appointment; vacancies.—
14	Members shall be appointed for the life of the Com-
15	mission. Any vacancy in the Commission shall not
16	affect its powers, but shall be filled in the same
17	manner as the original appointment.
18	(4) Initial meeting.—Not later than 30 days
19	after the date on which all members of the Commis-
20	sion have been appointed, the Commission shall hold
21	its first meeting.
22	(5) Meetings.—The Commission shall meet at

the call of the Chairperson.

1	(6) Quorum.—A majority of the members of
2	the Commission shall constitute a quorum, but a
3	lesser number of members may hold hearings.
4	(7) Chairperson.—The Commission shall se-
5	lect a Chairman and Vice Chairperson from among
6	its members.
7	(b) Duties of the Commission.—
8	(1) Study.—
9	(A) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection, the
10	terms "air carrier" and "air transportation"
11	have the meanings given those terms in section
12	40102(a) of title 49, United States Code.
13	(B) Contents.—The Commission shall
14	conduct a thorough study of the impacts of de-
15	regulation of the airline industry of the United
16	States on—
17	(i) the affordability, accessibility,
18	availability, and quality of air transpor-
19	tation, particularly in small-sized and me-
20	dium-sized communities;
21	(ii) economic development and job cre-
22	ation, particularly in areas that are under-
23	served by air carriers;
24	(iii) the economic viability of small-
25	sized airports; and

- 1 (iv) the long-term configuration of the 2 United States passenger air transportation 3 system.
  - (C) MEASUREMENT FACTORS.—In carrying out the study under this subsection, the Commission shall develop measurement factors to analyze the quality of passenger air transportation service provided by air carriers by identifying the factors that are generally associated with quality passenger air transportation service.
  - (D) Business and Leisure Travel.—In conducting measurements for an analysis of the affordability of air travel, to the extent practicable, the Commission shall provide for appropriate control groups and comparisons with respect to business and leisure travel.
  - (2) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Commission shall submit an interim report to the President and Congress, and not later than 18 months after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Commission shall submit a report to the President and the Congress. Each such report shall contain a detailed statement of the findings and conclusions of the

- Commission, together with its recommendations for such legislation and administrative actions as it considers appropriate.
  - (c) Powers of the Commission.—

- (1) Hearings.—The Commission may hold such hearings, sit and act at such times and places, take such testimony, and receive such evidence as the Commission considers advisable to carry out the duties of the Commission under this section.
- (2) Information from federal agencies.—
  The Commission may secure directly from any Federal department or agency such information as the Commission considers necessary to carry out the duties of the Commission under this section. Upon request of the Chairperson of the Commission, the head of such department or agency shall furnish such information to the Commission.
- (3) Postal Services.—The Commission may use the United States mails in the same manner and under the same conditions as other departments and agencies of the Federal Government.
- (4) GIFTS.—The Commission may accept, use, and dispose of gifts or donations of services or property.
- 25 (d) Commission Personnel Matters.—

(1) Travel expenses.—The members of the Commission shall be allowed travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates authorized for employees of agencies under subchapter I of chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code, while away from their homes or regular places of business in the performance of services for the Commission.

### (2) Staff.—

- (A) In General.—The Chairperson of the Commission may, without regard to the civil service laws and regulations, appoint and terminate an executive director and such other additional personnel as may be necessary to enable the Commission to perform its duties. The employment of an executive director shall be subject to confirmation by the Commission.
- (B) Compensation.—The Chairperson of the Commission may fix the compensation of the executive director and other personnel without regard to the provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53 of title 5, United States Code, relating to classification of positions and General Schedule pay rates, except that the rate of pay for the executive director and other personnel may not exceed the rate

- payable for level V of the Executive Schedule under section 5316 of such title.
- 3 (3) DETAIL OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES.—
  4 Any Federal Government employee may be detailed
  5 to the Commission without reimbursement, and such
  6 detail shall be without interruption or loss of civil
  7 service status or privilege.
- 8 (4) Procurement of Temporary and inter-9 MITTENT SERVICES.—The Chairperson of the Com-10 mission may procure temporary and intermittent 11 services under section 3109(b) of title 5, United 12 States Code, at rates for individuals which do not 13 exceed the daily equivalent of the annual rate of 14 basic pay prescribed for level V of the Executive 15 Schedule under section 5316 of such title.
- 16 (e) TERMINATION OF COMMISSION.—The Commis-17 sion shall terminate 90 days after the date on which the 18 Commission submits its report under subsection (b).
- 19 (f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
- 20 (1) IN GENERAL.—There is authorized to be 21 appropriated \$1,500,000 for fiscal year 2000 to the 22 Commission to carry out this section.

1	(2) AVAILABILITY.—Any sums appropriated
2	pursuant to the authorization of appropriations in
3	paragraph (1) shall remain available until expended.
