Mr. Crane introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To authorize the transfer to the Republic of Panama of certain properties of the United States as set forth in the Panama Canal Treaties.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Panama Canal Trea-
- 5 ties Property Transfer Authorization Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 The Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) Article IV, section 3 of the Constitution
- 9 provides (in part) the following: "The Congress shall
- 10 have the Power to dispose of and make all needful

- Rules and Regulations respecting the Territory or other Property belonging to the United States;".
- 2 (2) It is clear that the Constitution authorizes
 Congress to approve any alienation, transfer, or disposal of any property held as United States territory. Such alienation or disposal should be exercised
 by statute.

8 SEC. 3. PURPOSES.

- The purposes of this Act are to—
- (1) reassert, reiterate, and reestablish that the Congress retains its prerogative under the Constitution to authorize by law the alienation of any United States property before it is to be transferred to any other entity;
 - (2) encourage future Executive cooperation and compliance with the property clause of the Constitution in regard to the alienation and transfer of United States territory;
 - (3) resolve the concern expressed by many citizens that the Congress should have a direct vote to authorize the alienation and transfer to the Republic of Panama of such United States territories and properties as set forth in the Treaty on the Permanent Neutrality and Operation of the Panama

3	(4) finally bring to an end any remaining con-
4	cerns and controversies regarding the legitimacy of
5	the Panama Canal Treaties.
6	SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF PROPERTY TRANSFERS TO RE-
7	PUBLIC OF PANAMA.
8	(a) Congress, noting that certain transfers to the Re-
9	public of Panama of United States-held properties in the
10	Republic of Panama have been and are being carried out
11	pursuant to the Panama Canal Treaties, hereby confirms
12	and authorizes those transfers, as of December 31, 1999.
13	(b) For purposes of subsection (a), the term "Pan-
14	ama Canal Treaties" means—
15	(1) the Treaty on the Permanent Neutrality
16	and Operation of the Panama Canal; and
17	(2) the Panama Canal Treaty.

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
