## A BILL

For the relief of Henry R. Jones.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SATISFACTION OF CLAIM AGAINST THE UNITED 4 STATES. 5 The Secretary of the Treasury shall pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,250,000 to Henry R. Jones, whose mailing ad-7 8 dress on January 30, 1989, was Route 2, Box 331, Philadelphia, Tennessee 37846. The payment under this section 10 shall be in full satisfaction of all claims that Mr. Jones may have against the United States arising out of his co-

- 1 operation as an informant for the Drug Enforcement Ad-
- 2 ministration.

## 3 SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON ATTORNEY'S FEES.

- 4 It shall be unlawful for an amount exceeding 10 per-
- 5 cent of the amount paid pursuant to section 1 to be paid
- 6 to, or received by, any agent or attorney for any service
- 7 rendered in connection with the claim described in such
- 8 section. Any person who violates this section shall be
- 9 guilty of an infraction, and shall be subject to a fine in
- 10 the amount provided in title 18, United States Code.
