A BILL

To amend title 18 of the United States Code to prevent stalking of minors, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Jennifer Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. ENHANCED PENALTY FOR STALKING A MINOR.
- 6 Section 2261A of title 18, United States Code, is
- 7 amended by adding at the end the following:
- 8 "If the victim of the offense has not attained the age of
- 9 16 years at the time of the offense, the maximum term

- 1 of imprisonment for a violation of this section shall be
- 2 twice the term otherwise provided by section 2261.".

3 SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

- 4 It is the sense of Congress that each State should
- 5 have in effect by January 1, 2003, a law that makes stalk-
- 6 ing a minor under 16 years old a crime which does not
- 7 have as one if its elements actual physical harm or con-
- 8 tact.

9 SEC. 4. MODEL STATUTE.

- Not later than six months after the date of enactment
- 11 of this Act, the Attorney General shall prepare a model
- 12 statute, based upon the Florida Jennifer Act (Florida
- 13 Statutes § 784.048), for use by any of the several States
- 14 and any district, commonwealth, territory, or possession
- 15 of the United States, which does not have statutory provi-
- 16 sions substantially similar to that model statute.
