Mrs. Mink of Hawaii introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To amend title II of the Social Security Act to provide for continued entitlement to child's insurance benefits of individuals who marry after attaining age 18 and who have Hansen's disease.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. CONTINUED ENTITLEMENT TO CHILD'S INSURANCE BENEFITS OF INDIVIDUALS WHO
MARRY AFTER ATTAINING AGE 18 AND WHO
HAVE HANSEN'S DISEASE.

Section 202(d)(5) of the Social Security Act (42)

U.S.C. 402(d)(5)) is amended—

- 1 (1) by striking "who marries—" and inserting
 2 "who marries, if the spouse is—"; and
- (2) by striking "such child's entitlement" and
 inserting "or if such child is under a disability based
 in whole or in part on an impairment resulting from
 Hansen's disease, such child's entitlement".

7 SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

The amendments made by section 1 shall apply in the case of marriages occurring before, on, or after the date of the enactment of this Act, but only with respect to benefits for months ending after 180 days after such date.

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
