- 4 SOURCES SYSTEM MAPS.
- 5 (a) In General.—The 7 maps described in sub-
- 6 section (b) are replaced by 14 maps entitled "Dare Coun-
- 7 ty, North Carolina, Coastal Barrier Resources System,
- 8 Cape Hatteras Unit NC-03P" or "Dare County, North
- 9 Carolina, Coastal Barrier Resources System, Cape Hat-

- 1 teras Unit NC-03P, Hatteras Island Unit L03" and dated
- 2 October 18, 1999.
- 3 (b) Description of Maps.—The maps described in
- 4 this subsection are the 7 maps that—
- 5 (1) relate to the portions of Cape Hatteras Unit
- 6 NC-03P and Hatteras Island Unit L03 that are lo-
- 7 cated in Dare County, North Carolina; and
- 8 (2) are included in a set of maps entitled
- 9 "Coastal Barrier Resources System", dated October
- 10 24, 1990, and referred to in section 4(a) of the
- 11 Coastal Barrier Resources Act (16 U.S.C. 3503(a)).
- 12 (c) AVAILABILITY.—The Secretary of the Interior
- 13 shall keep the maps referred to in subsection (a) on file
- 14 and available for inspection in accordance with section
- 15 4(b) of the Coastal Barrier Resources Act (16 U.S.C.
- 16 3503(b)).
