A BILL

To amend title 23, United States Code, to authorize the use of funds to construct or install certain pedestrian safety features.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Pedestrian Safety
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. USE OF FUNDS FOR PEDESTRIAN SAFETY FEA-
- 7 TURES.
- 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title 23, United States Code, is
- 9 amended—

1	(1) in section 101, by inserting "or safety fea-
2	tures" after "transportation: provision of facilities";
3	and
4	(2) in section 217—
5	(A) in the heading, by striking "walk-
6	ways" and inserting "safety features";
7	(B) in subsections (a), (b), and (c), by
8	striking "construction of pedestrian walkways"
9	each place it appears and inserting "construc-
10	tion or installation of pedestrian safety fea-
11	tures''; and
12	(C) in subsection (j)—
13	(i) by redesignating paragraph (4) as
14	paragraph (5); and
15	(ii) by inserting after paragraph (3)
16	the following:
17	"(4) Pedestrian safety feature.—The
18	term 'pedestrian safety feature' includes—
19	"(A) any pedestrian walkway;
20	"(B) any traffic control device that gives
21	pedestrians and bicyclists exclusive use of a
22	roadway for short periods of time;
23	"(C) any crosswalk that includes diagonal
24	or longitudinal lines;

1	"(D) any crosswalk that is raised or that
2	includes other features that slow vehicular traf-
3	fic to permit pedestrians and bicyclists to use a
4	roadway;
5	"(E) any speed bump designed to enhance
6	pedestrian safety;
7	"(F) any lighting designed to enhance pe-
8	destrian safety;
9	"(G) any traffic circle in an intersection
10	that replaces traffic control devices on non-arte-
11	rial streets; and
12	"(H) any study on the feasibility of con-
13	structing or installing any facility or device de-
14	scribed in subparagraphs (A) through (G).".
15	(b) Conforming Amendment.—The analysis for
16	chapter 2 of title 23, United States Code, is amended by
17	striking the item relating to section 217 and inserting the
18	following:

"217. Bicycle transportation and pedestrian safety features.".
