A BILL

To eliminate the requirement that fingerprints be supplied for background checks on volunteers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Volunteer Organization
- 5 Safety Act of 1999".
- 6 SEC. 2. VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATION SAFETY.
- 7 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
- 8 United States Government shall not require, as a condi-
- 9 tion of completing a State and Federal criminal history
- 10 check, otherwise authorized by law, through the national

- 1 criminal history background check system into the back-
- 2 ground of a volunteer worker for purposes of determining
- 3 whether such volunteer worker is fit for the work, that
- 4 the requesting entity supply the fingerprints of that volun-

5 teer worker.
