4	(a) In General.—(1) Chapter 80 of title 10, United
5	States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6	lowing new section:
7	"§ 1563. Reports of suspected child abuse occurring
8	on military installations: anonymity for
9	persons making reports
10	"The Secretary of Defense shall prescribe regulations
11	to ensure that the procedures of the Department of De-
12	fense for receiving reports of suspected child abuse occur-
13	ring on a military installation include procedures to ensure
14	that such a report may be made anonymously, if so desired
15	by the person making the report.".
16	(2) The table of sections at the beginning of such
17	chapter is amended by adding at the end the following
18	new item:
	"1563. Reports of suspected child abuse occurring on military installations: anonymity for persons making reports.".
19	(b) Effective Date.—The Secretary of Defense
20	shall prescribe regulations under section 1563 of title 10,
21	United States Code, as added by subsection (a), not later
22	than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.
