(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
the date that is 15 days after the date of the enactment
of this Act.
(c) Retroactive Application.—Notwithstanding
section 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514)
or any other provision of law, upon proper request filed
with the Customs Service on or before the date that is
90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, any
entry, or withdrawal from warehouse for consumption, of
goods described in subheading 2933.90.79 of the Har-
monized Tariff Schedule of the United States—
(1) which was made after January 1, 1999, and
before the date that is 15 days after the date of the
enactment of this Act, and
(2) with respect to which there would have been
no duty if the amendment made by subsection (a)
applied to such entry or withdrawal,
shall be liquidated or reliquidated as if such amendment
