- 3 SECTION 1. RESPONSIBILITY OF PARENT CORPORATION
- 4 TO PROVIDE HEALTH CARE COVERAGE TO
- 5 RETIREES OF SUBSIDIARY CORPORATION.
- 6 (a) In General.—Section 2(a) of the Service Con-
- 7 tract Act of 1965 (Public Law 89–286; 41 U.S.C. 351(a))

- 1 is amended by adding at the end the following new para-2 graph:
- 3 "(6) A provision specifying that if the contract is terminated, if the contract or a collective bar-5 gaining agreement required that the contractor pro-6 vide health care to contractor employees who per-7 formed work to carry out the contract and who retired before the contract was terminated, a parent 8 9 corporation of the contractor shall be responsible for the provision of such health care coverage to such 10 11 retired employees if the contractor fails to provide such coverage.". 12
- 13 (b) APPLICABILITY.—The amendment made by sub-14 section (a) shall apply with respect to contracts for which 15 bids are solicited after the date of the enactment of this 16 Act.
