A BILL

To amend the Marine Protection, Research, and Sanctuaries Act of 1972 relating to the dumping of dredged material in the Historic Area Remediation Site, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DUMPING OF DREDGED MATERIALS IN HIS-**
4 **TORIC AREA REMEDIATION SITE.**

5 Section 106 of the Marine Protection, Research, and
6 Sanctuaries Act of 1972 (33 U.S.C. 1416) is amended—

7 (1) by redesignating subsection (g) as sub-
8 section (h); and

1 (2) by inserting after subsection (f) the fol-
2 lowing:

3 “(g) DUMPING OF DREDGED MATERIAL IN HISTORIC
4 AREA REMEDIATION SITE.—

5 “(1) IN GENERAL.—No dredged material from
6 any Federal project, or from any non-Federal
7 project, may be dumped in the dredged materials
8 disposal area located approximately 6 miles east of
9 Sandy Hook, New Jersey, and known as the ‘His-
10 toric Area Remediation Site’.

11 “(2) RELATION TO OTHER LAW.—Subsection
12 (d) shall not apply to this subsection.”.
