To prevent the theft of firearms from commercial carriers.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

 SECTION 1. DUTIES OF COMMERCIAL CARRIERS WHO ARE

 SHIPPING FIREARMS.

 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 922 of title 18, United

 States Code, is amended by inserting after subsection (y)

 the following:

 "(z)(1) A common or contract carrier who is transporting, shipping, or delivering a firearm in interstate or
- 11 "(A) shall, through electronic tracking, be 12 aware of the identity of each individual who has cus-

1	tody of or control over the firearm, and the location
2	of the firearm;
3	"(B) shall complete the transportation, ship-
4	ment, or delivery within 24 hours;
5	"(C) shall report the theft or loss of the firearm
6	within 24 hours after the theft or loss is discovered,
7	to the Secretary and to the appropriate local au-
8	thorities; and
9	"(D) shall not authorize an individual to have
10	such custody or control, or assign to any individual
11	the function of being aware of the information de-
12	scribed in subparagraph (A) of this paragraph, un-
13	less the common or contract carrier—
14	"(i) has contacted the national instant
15	criminal background check system established
16	under section 103 of the Brady Handgun Vio-
17	lence Prevention Act and requested information
18	from the system on whether receipt of a firearm
19	by the individual would violate subsection (g) or
20	(n) of this section or State law; and
21	"(ii) has received from the system an indi-
22	cation that receipt of a firearm by the indi-
23	vidual would not violate subsection (g) or (n) of
24	this section or State law.

1	"(2) Paragraph (2) of subsection (t) shall apply to
2	this subsection as if the common or contract carrier were
3	the licensee and the request for information described in
4	paragraph (1)(D) of this subsection were a transfer.".
5	(b) Civil Money Penalties.—Section 924 of such
6	title is amended by adding at the end the following:
7	"(p) The Secretary shall impose on any common or
8	contract carrier who violates section 922(z) a civil money
9	penalty in an amount equal to not less than \$100,000 and
10	not more than \$250,000, for each shipment with respect
11	to which violation occurs.".
12	(c) Authority of Commercial Carriers To Con-
13	TACT AND RECEIVE INFORMATION FROM THE NATIONAL
14	INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK SYSTEM.—
15	(1) In general.—Section 103(b) of the Brady
16	Handgun Violence Prevention Act (18 U.S.C. 922
17	note) is amended—
18	(A) by inserting "or common carrier" after
19	"licensee"; and
20	(B) by inserting "or employee" after
21	"transferee".
22	(2) Conforming amendments.—Section
23	103(g) of such Act (18 U.S.C. 922 note) is amended
24	by inserting "or employee" after "transferee" each
25	place it appears.

1	SEC. 2. LOWER THRESHOLD OF PROOF IN CASES ALLEGING
2	FAILURE OF LICENSEE TO REPORT THEFT
3	OR LOSS OF FIREARM.
4	Section 924(a)(1) of title 18, United States Code, is

6	(1) by striking "or" at the end of subparagraph

8	(2) by redesignating subparagraph (D) as sub-

10	(3) by inserting after subparagraph (C) the fol-

12	"(D) knowingly or with reckless disregard vio-
13	lates section 923(g)(6); or".
14	SEC. 3. INCREASE IN PENALTY FOR STEALING A FIREARM.
15	Subsections (l) and (m) of section 922 of title 18,
16	United States Code, are each amended by striking "not
17	more than 10 years" and inserting "not less than 5 years
18	and not more than 20 years".

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
