A BILL

To amend the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 to provide that the Act will not apply to employment performed in a workplace located in the employee's residence.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "American Telecom-
- 5 muter Protection Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 The Congress finds the following:

1	(1) It is the best option for many as they raise
2	families or deal with illness to perform their work at
3	home.
4	(2) OSHA and other Government entities
5	should not interfere with the home lives of law-abid-
6	ing Americans.
7	(3) The Federal Government should not put
8	employers in a situation where they are required to
9	interfere with the home life of an employee.
10	(4) The home work environment is sufficiently
11	different from the work environment envisioned in
12	the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970.
13	SEC. 3. APPLICATION OF OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND
14	HEALTH ACT OF 1970.
15	Section 4(b) of the Occupational Safety and Health
16	Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 653(b)) is amended by adding at
17	the end the following:
18	"(5) Nothing in this Act shall apply to employment
19	performed in a workplace which is located in the residence
