Mr. SMITH of New Jersey introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

- To amend the Marine Protection, Research, and Sanctuaries Act of 1972 to direct the Secretary of the Army to prohibit ocean dumping at the Historic Area Remediation Site, located east of Sandy Hook, New Jersey, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Mud Dump Permanent
- 5 Closure and Remediation Act of 2000".

3 Section 103 of the Marine Protection, Research, and
4 Sanctuaries Act of 1972 (33 U.S.C. 1413) is amended by
5 adding at the end the following:

6 "(f) HISTORIC AREA REMEDIATION SITE.—

"(1) PROHIBITION ON OCEAN DUMPING.—Except as provided by paragraph (2), after the date of
enactment of this subsection, dumping shall be prohibited at the Historic Area Remediation Site (as
defined in subsection (g)).

12 "(2) PERMITS FOR REMEDIATION.—After the 13 date of issuance of standards for remediation mate-14 rials under subsection (g), the Secretary may issue 15 permits under this section authorizing the transpor-16 tation of dredged materials to the Historic Area Re-17 mediation Site solely for the purpose of providing for 18 remediation of the site.

"(3) REMEDIATION TO BE FOLLOWED BY PERMANENT CLOSURE.—Upon satisfying the goal specified in subsection (g)(2)(B) at the Historic Area Remediation Site, as determined by the Administrator,
the Secretary shall not issue any further permits
under this section authorizing the transportation of
dredged materials to the site for any purpose.

1 "(4) EXISTING PERMITS.—A permit issued 2 under this section before the date of enactment of 3 this subsection shall not be effective to the extent 4 that the permit authorizes dumping in violation of 5 this subsection.

6 "(5) ADVANCE NOTICE OF PERMITS.—At least 7 30 days before issuing a permit under paragraph 8 (2), the Secretary shall provide written notice of the 9 permit to the Governors of the States of New York 10 and New Jersey and to each Member of Congress 11 representing one of such States. This paragraph 12 shall not be construed to affect any notification requirement under any other provision of law.". 13

14 SEC. 3. STANDARDS FOR REMEDIATION MATERIALS.

15 Section 103 of the Marine Protection, Research, and
16 Sanctuaries Act of 1972 (33 U.S.C. 1413) is further
17 amended by adding at the end the following:

18 "(g) Standards for Remediation Materials.— 19 DEVELOPMENT OF ((1))STANDARDS.—Not 20 later than 90 days after the date of enactment of 21 this subsection, the Administrator, in consultation 22 with the Under Secretary for Oceans and Atmos-23 phere, shall develop and publish in the Federal Reg-24 ister standards for evaluating dredged materials to

1	be used solely for remediation purposes at the His-
2	toric Area Remediation Site.
3	"(2) Requirements for standards.—
4	"(A) IN GENERAL.—In developing stand-
5	ards under paragraph (1), the Administrator
6	shall ensure that the materials used for
7	remediation—
8	"(i) contain significantly lower levels
9	of contaminants (as referred to in section
10	227.6 of title 40, Code of Federal Regula-
11	tions), including polycyclic aromatic hydro-
12	carbons and polyclorinated biphenyls, than
13	exist at the Historic Area Remediation
14	Site;
15	"(ii) will significantly reduce contami-
16	nation levels in biota and sediments at the
17	Historic Area Remediation Site; and
18	"(iii) will reduce both the number, ex-
19	tent, and magnitude of undesirable effects
20	on marine life in and around the Historic
21	Area Remediation Site, including through
22	bioaccumulation.
23	"(B) GOAL.—The goal of the standards to
24	be developed under paragraph (1) shall be to
25	reduce the level of contamination at the His-

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1	toric Area Remediation Site to a level that re-
2	flects background ambient contamination levels
3	in the ocean.
4	"(3) NOTICE AND COMMENT.—The Adminis-
5	trator shall provide notice and an opportunity for
6	public comment before issuing final standards under
7	paragraph (1).
8	"(4) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection, the fol-
9	lowing definitions apply:
10	"(A) BACKGROUND AMBIENT CONTAMINA-
11	TION LEVELS.—The term 'background ambient
12	contamination levels' means a level of contami-
13	nation that is substantially equivalent to or less
14	than—
15	"(i) the levels of contamination in
16	biota and sediments found occurring natu-
17	rally in the ocean in areas that have never
18	been impacted by ocean dumping; and
19	"(ii) the levels of contamination found
20	in the clean reference sediments used by
21	the Environmental Protection Agency when
22	testing and evaluating remediation mate-
23	rials to be deposited at the Historic Area
24	Remediation Site.

"(B) CLEAN REFERENCE SEDIMENTS.— 1 2 The term 'clean reference sediments' means a 3 sediment, substantially free of contaminants, 4 that is as similar to the grain size of the 5 dredged material and the sediment at the disposal site as practical, and reflects conditions 6 7 that would exist in the vicinity of the disposal site had no dredged material disposal ever oc-8 9 curred, but had all other influences on sediment 10 taken place.

"(C) 11 HISTORIC AREA REMEDIATION SITE.—The term 'Historic Area Remediation 12 13 Site' means the dredged material disposal area 14 known by that name that is located east of 15 Sandy Hook, New Jersey, and described in sec-16 tion 228.15(d)(6) of title 40, Code of Federal 17 Regulations (as in effect on July 1, 1999).".

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
