- 7 Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (defining social security
- 8 benefit) is amended by striking paragraph (3) and by re-

- 1 designating paragraphs (4) and (5) as paragraphs (3) and
- 2 (4), respectively.
- 3 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 4 this section shall apply to all taxable years beginning be-
- 5 fore, on, or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
