A BILL

To provide for disclosure of fire safety standards and measures with respect to campus buildings, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Campus Fire Safety
- 5 Right-to-Know Act of 2000".

1	SEC. 2. DISCLOSURE OF FIRE SAFETY OF CAMPUS BUILD-
2	INGS.
3	Section 485 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
4	U.S.C. 1092) is amended—
5	(1) in subsection $(a)(1)$ —
6	(A) by striking "and" at the end of sub-
7	paragraph (N);
8	(B) by striking the period at the end of
9	subparagraph (O) and inserting "; and; and
10	(C) by adding at the end the following new
11	subparagraph:
12	"(P) the fire safety report prepared by the in-
13	stitution pursuant to subsection (h)."; and
14	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
15	section:
16	"(h) DISCLOSURE OF FIRE SAFETY STANDARDS AND
17	Measures.—
18	"(1) Fire safety reports required.—Each
19	eligible institution participating in any program
20	under this title shall, beginning in academic year
21	2001–2002, and each year thereafter, prepare, pub-
22	lish, and distribute, through appropriate publications
23	or mailings, to all current students and employees,
24	and to any applicant for enrollment or employment
25	upon request, an annual fire safety report containing
26	at least the following information with respect to the

1	campus fire safety practices and standards of that
2	institution:
3	"(A) A statement that identifies each stu-
4	dent housing facility of the institution, and
5	whether or not that facility is equipped with a
6	fire sprinkler system or other fire safety sys-
7	tems, or both.
8	"(B) Statistics concerning the occurrence
9	on campus, during the 2 preceding calendar
10	years for which data are available, of fires and
11	false fire alarms in student housing facilities.
12	"(C) For each such occurrence, a state-
13	ment of the human injuries or deaths and the
14	structural damage caused by the occurrence.
15	"(D) Information regarding fire alarms,
16	smoke alarms, the presence of adequate fire es-
17	cape planning or protocols (as defined in local
18	fire codes), rules on portable electrical appli-
19	ances, smoking and open flames (such as can-
20	dles), regular mandatory supervised fire drills,
21	and planned and future improvement in fire
22	safety.
23	"(2) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in
24	this subsection shall be construed to authorize the

Secretary to require particular policies, procedures,

1	or practices by institutions of higher education with
2	respect to fire safety.
3	"(3) REPORTS — Each institution participating

- "(3) Reports.—Each institution participating in any program under this title shall make periodic reports to the campus community on fires and false fire alarms that are reported to local fire departments in a manner that will aid the prevention of similar occurrences.
- "(4) Reports to secretary.—On an annual basis, each institution participating in any program under this title shall submit to the Secretary a copy of the statistics required to be made available under paragraph (1)(B). The Secretary shall—
 - "(A) review such statistics;
 - "(B) make copies of the statistics submitted to the Secretary available to the public; and
 - "(C) in coordination with representatives of institutions of higher education, identify exemplary fire safety policies, procedures, and practices and disseminate information concerning those policies, procedures, and practices that have proven effective in the reduction of campus fires.

1	"(6) Definitions.—In this subsection, the
2	term 'campus' has the meaning provided in sub-
3	section $(f)(6)$.".
4	SEC. 3. REPORT TO CONGRESS BY SECRETARY OF EDU-
5	CATION.
6	Within one year after the date of enactment of this
7	Act, the Secretary of Education shall prepare and submit
8	to the Congress a report containing—
9	(1) an analysis of the current status of fire
10	safety systems in college and university facilities, in-
11	cluding sprinkler systems;
12	(2) an analysis of the appropriate fire safety
13	standards to apply to these facilities, which the Sec-
14	retary shall prepare after consultation with such fire
15	safety experts, representatives of institutions of
16	higher education, and other Federal agencies as the
17	Secretary, in the Secretary's discretion, considers
18	appropriate;
19	(3) an estimate of the cost of bringing all non-
20	conforming dormitories and other campus buildings
21	up to current new building codes; and
22	(4) recommendations from the Secretary con-
23	cerning the best means of meeting fire safety stand-

- 1 ards in all college facilities, including recommenda-
- 2 tions for methods to fund such cost.
