- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 141(a) of title 13, United
- 6 States Code, is amended by striking the last sentence and
- 7 inserting the following: "In connection with any such cen-
- 8 sus, the Secretary is authorized to request no information
- 9 aside from the number of individuals residing or staying

- 1 at a particular address or location, and the names of those

- 3 (b) Conforming Amendment.—Section 141(f) of
- 4 title 13, United States Code, is amended by striking the
