A BILL

To make Federal law apply to antique firearms in the same
way it applies to other firearms.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Antique Firearm Safe-
5 ty Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF EXEMPTIONS FOR ANTIQUE FIRE-**
2 **ARMS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 921(a)(3) of title 18,
4 United States Code, is amended by striking the last sen-
5 tence.

6 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section
7 922(v)(3)(B) of such title is amended—

8 (1) by adding “or” at the end of clause (i);

9 (2) by striking “or” at the end of clause (ii);

10 and

11 (3) by striking clause (iii).

12 (c) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 90 days after the
13 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the
14 Treasury shall prescribe such regulations as may be nec-
15 essary to administer chapter 44 of title 18, United States
16 Code, as in effect pursuant to the amendments made by
17 this Act.
