Mr. EDWARDS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit certain abortions.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Banning Late Term
- 5 Abortions Act''.
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN ABORTIONS.
- 7 (a) In General.—It shall be unlawful, in or affect-
- 8 ing interstate or foreign commerce, knowingly to perform
- 9 an abortion after the fetus has become viable.

- 1 (b) Exception.—This section does not prohibit any
- 2 abortion if, at the time of the abortion the physician con-
- 3 cludes in good faith according to the physician's best med-
- 4 ical judgment, the abortion is necessary to preserve the
- 5 life of the woman or to avert serious adverse health con-
- 6 sequences to the woman.
- 7 (c) CIVIL PENALTY.—A physician who violates this
- 8 section shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed
- 9 \$100,000.
