 - 3 SECTION 1. LIMITATION.
 - 4 (a) In General.—Section 221 of title 13, United
 - 5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
 - 6 lowing:
 - 7 "(d)(1) In the case of a schedule used in taking a
 - 8 decennial census of population under section 141, sub-

- 1 section (a) of this section shall be applied by substituting
- 2 '\$10' for '\$100' whenever the condition under paragraph
- 3 (2) is met.
- 4 "(2) This subsection applies so long as the schedule
- 5 (referred to in paragraph (1)) is returned complete with
- 6 the response or responses necessary to permit a deter-
- 7 mination as to the number of individuals living or staying
- 8 in the house, apartment, or other location involved.".
- 9 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 10 subsection (a) shall apply to a decennial census taken in
- 11 2000 or later, including with respect to schedules returned
- 12 before the date of enactment of this Act.
