## A BILL

To declare the policy of the United States with regard to the constitutional requirement of a decennial census for purposes of the apportionment of Representatives in Congress among the several States.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. POLICY.**

4       It is the policy of the United States that—

5               (1) the sole purpose of the decennial enumera-  
6       tion of the population, under article I, section 2,  
7       clause 3 of the Constitution and section 2 of the

1 14th article of amendment to the Constitution, is to  
2 allow for the apportionment of Representatives in  
3 Congress among the several States;

4 (2) the only information needed in order to  
5 carry out that purpose are the names, ages, and the  
6 number of individuals residing in a household, and  
7 the address or location of such household; and

8 (3) the penalty for refusing or neglecting to an-  
9 swer questions on a decennial census questionnaire  
10 shall be imposed only in the case of individuals fail-  
11 ing to provide the information described in para-  
12 graph (2).
