A BILL

To provide for the establishment of an Amateur Sports Illegal Gambling Task Force; to increase penalties for illegal sports gambling; and to study illegal sports gambling behavior among minor persons.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Illegal Sports Betting
- 5 Enforcement Act of 2000".

1	SEC. 2. AMATEUR SPORTS ILLEGAL GAMBLING TASK
2	FORCE.
3	(a) Appointment of Task Force.—The Attorney
4	General shall establish in the Department of Justice an
5	Amateur Sports Illegal Gambling Task Force.
6	(b) Duties.—The duties of the Amateur Sports Ille-
7	gal Gambling Task Force are—
8	(1) to enforce Federal laws that prohibit gam-
9	bling relating to amateur sporting events and con-
10	tests, and
11	(2) to submit annually, to the Speaker of the
12	House of Representatives and the President pro
13	tempore of the Senate, a report describing with re-
14	spect to violations of such laws, prosecutions com-
15	menced, and convictions obtained during the period
16	for which such report is submitted.
17	(c) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
18	are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
19	\$3,000,000 for fiscal year 2001 and $$5,000,000$ for each
20	of the fiscal years 2002, 2003, 2004, and 2005.
21	SEC. 3. INCREASED PENALTIES FOR ILLEGAL SPORTS GAM-
22	BLING.
23	(a) Interstate Transmission of Bets or Infor-
24	MATION ASSISTING IN PLACING BETS ON SPORTING
25	Events.—Section 1084(a) of title 18, United States
26	Code, is amended by striking "two" and inserting "5".

- 1 (b) Interstate Transportation of Wagering
- 2 Paraphernalia.—Section 1953(a) of title 18, United
- 3 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 4 lowing: "If the matter carried or sent in interstate or for-
- 5 eign commerce was intended by the defendant to be used
- 6 to assist in the placing of bets or wagers on any sporting
- 7 event or contest, the maximum term of imprisonment for
- 8 the offense shall be 10 years.".
- 9 (c) Illegal Gambling Business.—Section 1955(a)
- 10 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by adding at
- 11 the end the following: "If the gambling business included
- 12 the placing of bets or wagers on any sporting event or
- 13 contest, the maximum term of imprisonment for the of-
- 14 fense shall be 10 years.".
- 15 (d) Interstate Travel To Promote and Con-
- 16 Duct an Illegal Gambling Business.—Section 1952
- 17 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by adding at
- 18 the end the following:
- 19 "(d) If the offense violated paragraph (1) or (3) of
- 20 subsection (a) and the illegal activity included the placing
- 21 of bets or wagers on any sporting event or contest, the
- 22 maximum term of imprisonment for the offense shall be
- 23 10 years.".
- 24 (e) Sports Bribery.—Section 224(a) of title 18,
- 25 United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the

- 1 following: "If the purpose of the bribery is to affect the
- 2 outcome of a bet or wager placed on any sporting event
- 3 or contest, the maximum term of imprisonment for the
- 4 offense shall be 10 years.".

5 SEC. 4. STUDY ON ILLEGAL SPORTS GAMBLING BEHAVIOR

- 6 AMONG MINOR PERSONS.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Director of the National In-
- 8 stitute of Justice shall conduct a study to determine the
- 9 extent to which minor persons participate in illegal sports
- 10 gambling activities.
- 11 (b) Report.—Not later than 2 years after the date
- 12 of the enactment of this Act, the Director of the National
- 13 Institute of Justice shall submit to the Speaker of the
- 14 House of Representatives and the President pro tempore
- 15 of the Senate, a report—
- 16 (1) describing the extent to which minor per-
- sons participate in illegal sports gambling activities,
- 18 and
- 19 (2) making recommendations on actions that
- should be taken to curtail participation by minor
- 21 persons in sports gambling activities.
- 22 SEC. 5. SENSE OF THE CONGRESS.
- It is the sense of the Congress as follows:

- (1) Illegal sports gambling poses a significant threat to youth on college campuses and in society in general.
 - (2) State and local governments, the National Collegiate Athletic Association, and other youth, school, and collegiate organizations should provide educational and prevention programs to help youth recognize the dangers of illegal sports gambling and the serious consequences it can have.
 - (3) Such programs should include public service announcements, especially during tournament and bowl game coverage.
 - (4) The National Collegiate Athletic Association and other amateur sports governing bodies should adopt mandatory codes of conduct regarding the avoidance and prevention of illegal sports gambling among our youth.
 - (5) The National Collegiate Athletic Association should enlist universities in the United States to develop scientific research on youth sports gambling, and related matters.
