## A BILL

To amend the Migratory Bird Treaty Act to restore certain penalties under that Act.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Migratory Bird Pen-
- 5 alty Restoration Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. RESTORATION OF PENALTIES.
- 7 Section 6 of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (16
- 8 U.S.C. 707) is amended—

1	(1) by striking subsection (a) and inserting the
2	following:
3	"(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any
4	person, association, partnership, or corporation who shall
5	violate any provisions of said conventions or of this Act,
6	or who shall violate or fail to comply with any regulation
7	made pursuant to this Act shall be deemed guilty of a mis-
8	demeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not
9	more than \$5000 or be imprisoned not more than six
10	months, or both."; and
11	(2) by striking subsection (c) and inserting the
12	following:
13	"(c) A person who violates section 3(b)(2) shall be
14	fined not more than \$5000 or be imprisoned not more
15	than 1 year, or both.".
