- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (b)(1) of the first sec-
- 8 tion of the Hate Crime Statistics Act (28 U.S.C. 534 note)
- 9 is amended—

1 (1) by striking "or" after "sexual orientation,";
2 and
3 (2) by inserting "or gender," after "ethnicity,".
4 (b) APPLICATION.—The amendment made by sub5 section (a) applies to data about crimes occurring on or
6 after the first day of the first calendar year after the en7 actment of this Act.
