Mr. NETHERCUTT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To direct the United States Sentencing Commission to provide penalty enhancements for drug offenses committed in the presence of children.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Save Our Children Act
5 of 1999”.

6 **SEC. 2. GUIDELINES.**

7 The United States Sentencing Commission shall
8 amend or promulgate sentencing guidelines no later than
9 120 days after the date of enactment of this Act to provide
10 that an offense under part D of the Controlled Substances

1 Act which is committed in the presence of a child receives
2 a penalty enhancement. The Sentencing Guidelines, as so
3 amended or promulgated, shall reflect a minimum 2 of-
4 fense levels greater than the offense level for the underly-
5 ing offense or one year, whichever is greater, and in the
6 case of a second such offense, not less than 4 offense levels
7 greater or 2 years than the offense level, whichever is
8 higher, for the underlying offense.

9 **SEC. 3. DEFINITION.**

10 For the purposes of this Act, an offense is in the
11 presence of a child if—

- 12 (1) it takes place in the line of sight of an indi-
13 vidual who has not attained the age of 18 years; or
14 (2) an individual who has not attained the age
15 of 18 years habitually resides in the place where the
16 violation occurs.
