3 SECTION 1. TRANSFER OF FUNCTION FROM FEDERAL 4 HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION.

5 Section 104(c) of title 49, United States Code, is
6 amended by inserting "and" after the semicolon at the end

of paragraph (1), by striking paragraph (2), and by redes ignating paragraph (3) as paragraph (2).

3 SEC. 2. TRANSFER OF FUNCTION TO NATIONAL HIGHWAY 4 TRAFFIC ADMINISTRATION.

5 Section 105(c) of title 49, United States Code, is
6 amended by striking "and" at the end of paragraph (1),
7 by redesignating paragraph (2) as paragraph (3), and by
8 inserting after paragraph (1) the following:

9 "(2) duties and powers related to motor carrier
10 safety vested in the Secretary by chapters 5 and 315
11 of this title; and".

12 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

13 The amendments made by sections 1 and 2 of this Act shall take effect on the 180th day following the date 14 15 of enactment of this Act; except that the Secretary of Transportation may take such action as may be necessary 16 to ensure the orderly transfer of the duties and powers 17 18 related to motor carrier safety vested in the Secretary by chapters 5 and 315 of title 49, United States Code, and 19 20 employees carrying out such duties and powers, from the 21 Federal Highway Administration to the National Highway 22 Traffic Safety Administration.
