Mr. BARTLETT of Maryland introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Roma Salobrit.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. IMMEDIATE RELATIVE STATUS FOR ROMA**
4 **SALOBKIT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Roma Salobrit shall be classified
6 as a child under section 101(b)(1)(F) of the Immigration
7 and Nationality Act for purposes of approval of a relative
8 visa petition filed under section 204 of such Act by her
9 adoptive parent and the filing of an application for an im-
10 migrant visa or adjustment of status.

11 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Roma Salobrit en-
12 ters the United States before the filing deadline specified

1 in subsection (c), she shall be considered to have entered
2 and remained lawfully and shall, if otherwise eligible, be
3 eligible for adjustment of status under section 245 of the
4 Immigration and Nationality Act as of the date of the en-
5 actment of this Act.

6 (c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF
7 FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the pe-
8 tition and the application for issuance of an immigrant
9 visa or the application for adjustment of status are filed
10 with appropriate fees within 2 years after the date of the
11 enactment of this Act.

12 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.—
13 Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-
14 idence to Roma Salobrit, the Secretary of State shall in-
15 struct the proper officer to reduce by 1, for the current
16 or next following fiscal year, the worldwide level of family-
17 sponsored immigrants under section 201(c)(1)(A) of the
18 Immigration and Nationality Act.

19 (e) DENIAL OF PREFERENTIAL IMMIGRATION
20 TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN RELATIVES.—The natural
21 parents, brothers, and sisters of Roma Salobrit shall not,
22 by virtue of such relationship, be accorded any right, privi-
23 lege, or status under the Immigration and Nationality Act.
