- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. STATUS; LIMITATION.
- 4 (a) Public Safety Officer Status.—For pur-
- 5 poses of part L of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control
- 6 and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796 et seq.),
- 7 Joseph Samuel Boyd, formerly of 26427 Waterford Circle,
- 8 Lake Forest, California, is deemed to have been a public

- 1 safety officer who died as the direct and proximate result
- 2 of a personal injury sustained in the line of duty.
- 3 (b) FEE LIMITATION.—Notwithstanding any con-
- 4 tract, no attorney or representative may receive more than
- 5 10 percent of a payment made as a result of subsection
- 6 (a) for services rendered in connection with obtaining such
- 7 payment. Any person who violates this section shall be
- 8 guilty of an infraction and shall be subject to a fine in
- 9 the amount provided in title 18, United States Code.
