A BILL

To prohibit Federal payments to any business, institution, or organization that engages in human cloning or human cloning techniques.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Human Cloning Pre-
- 5 vention Act of 1999".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION.
- 7 (a) General Rule.—Except as provided in sub-
- 8 section (b), no Federal agency shall—
- 9 (1) make any grant, contract, or other pay-
- ment; or

- 1 (2) enter into any obligation for making any
- 2 such payment,
- 3 to any business, institution, or organization that, within
- 4 the past one year, has engaged in human cloning, or to
- 5 any business, institution, or organization that controls, is
- 6 controlled by, or is under common control with any busi-
- 7 ness, institution, or organization that, within the past one
- 8 year, has engaged in human cloning.
- 9 (b) Exception.—Subsection (a)(1) shall not apply
- 10 to any payment a Federal agency is obligated to make.

11 SEC. 3. DEFINITION.

- For purposes of this Act, the term "human cloning"
- 13 means making an identical, or substantially identical, copy
- 14 of the genetic material of an individual human being, liv-
- 15 ing or deceased, so as to cultivate one or more new human
- 16 cells which could, if not otherwise engineered, develop into
- 17 a new individual human being.
