1	SECTION 1. PROHIBITING HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
2	CANDIDATES FROM ACCEPTING CONTRIBU-
3	TIONS FROM INDIVIDUAL NONRESIDENTS OF
4	THE CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT.
5	Section 315 of the Federal Election Campaign Act
6	of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 441a) is amended by adding at the end
7	the following new subsection:
8	"(i) A candidate for the office of Representative in,
9	or Delegate or Resident Commissioner to, the Congress
10	may not accept a contribution from any individual who
11	is not a resident of the congressional district involved.".
