A BILL

To require the Federal Communications Commission to eliminate from its regulations the restrictions on the cross-ownership of broadcasting stations and newspapers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CROSS-OWNERSHIP OF BROADCASTING AND
- 4 NEWSPAPERS.
- 5 (a) Rule Changes Required.—The Federal Com-
- 6 munications Commission shall modify section 73.3555 of
- 7 its regulations (47 C.F.R. 73.3555) by eliminating any
- 8 provisions limiting the granting or renewal of an AM, FM,
- 9 or TV broadcast station license to any party (including

- 1 parties under common control) on the basis of the owner-
- 2 ship, operation, or control by such party of a daily news-
- 3 paper.
- 4 (b) Deadline for Actions.—The Federal Commu-
- 5 nications Commission shall complete all actions necessary
- 6 to complete the modifications required by subsection (a)
- 7 within 90 days after the date of enactment of this Act.
