## A BILL

To rescind the consent of Congress to the Northeast Interstate Dairy Compact.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CONGRESSIONAL RESCISSION OF NORTHEAST**  
4 **INTERSTATE DAIRY COMPACT.**

5 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

6 (1) In section 147 of the Agricultural Market  
7 Transition Act (title I of Public Law 104–127; 7  
8 U.S.C. 7256), Congress gave conditional consent to

1 the Northeast Interstate Dairy Compact entered into  
2 among the States of Connecticut, Maine, Massachu-  
3 setts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont,  
4 as specified in section 1(b) of Senate Joint Resolu-  
5 tion 28 of the 104th Congress (as placed on the cal-  
6 endar of the Senate).

7 (2) In section 22 of the Northeast Interstate  
8 Dairy Compact, Congress expressly reserved the  
9 right to amend or rescind the Northeast Interstate  
10 Dairy Compact at any time.

11 (b) RESCISSION.—Pursuant to the reservation of au-  
12 thority referred to in subsection (a)(2), Congress hereby  
13 rescinds its consent to the Northeast Interstate Dairy  
14 Compact entered into among the States of Connecticut,  
15 Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island,  
16 and Vermont.

17 (c) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 147 of the  
18 Agricultural Market Transition Act (title I of Public Law  
19 104–127; 7 U.S.C. 7256) is repealed.

20 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section and the amend-  
21 ment made by this section shall take effect on the date  
22 of the enactment of this Act.
