To require the Secretary of Education to conduct a study and submit a report to the Congress on methods for identifying and treating children with dyslexia in kindergarten through 3rd grade.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Early Detection of
- 5 Dyslexia in Children Act of 1999".

1	SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT BY SECRETARY OF EDUCATION
2	ON IDENTIFICATION AND TREATMENT OF
3	CHILDREN WITH DYSLEXIA IN KINDER-
4	GARTEN THROUGH 3RD GRADE.
5	(a) Study.—The Secretary of Education, in con-
6	sultation with the National Academy of Sciences, shall
7	conduct a study on methods for identifying and treating
8	children with dyslexia in kindergarten through 3rd grade.
9	In carrying out the study, the Secretary shall consider—
10	(1) whether there is a biological basis for dys-
11	lexia;
12	(2) whether dyslexia is caused by—
13	(A) a brain-based phonological deficit that
14	prevents an individual from breaking down
15	written words into component sounds;
16	(B) post-natal experience, including inad-
17	equate instruction; or
18	(C) a combination thereof; and
19	(3) the cost of implementing a program on a
20	nationwide basis to identify and treat children with
21	dyslexia in kindergarten through 3rd grade.
22	(b) Report.—Not later than 120 days after the date
23	of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Education
24	shall prepare and submit to the Congress a report contain-

- 2 (a).

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
