- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Freedom to E-File
- 5 Act''
- 6 SEC. 2. ELECTRONIC FILING AND RETRIEVAL.
- 7 (a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
- 8 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Agriculture
- 9 shall establish an electronic filing and retrieval system to
- 10 enable the public to file all required paperwork electroni-
- 11 cally with the Department of Agriculture and to have ac-
- 12 cess to public information on farm programs, quarterly
- 13 trade, economic, and production reports, and other similar
- 14 information.
- 15 (b) Progress Reports.—Not later than 90 days
- 16 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall

report to Congress the progress made toward implementing subsection (a). 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 4 This Act may be cited as the "Freedom to E-File Act". SEC. 2. ELECTRONIC FILING AND RETRIEVAL. 6 (a) Establishment of Internet-Based System.— The Secretary of Agriculture shall establish an electronic 8 filing and retrieval system that uses the telecommunications medium known as the Internet to enable farmers and other 10 persons— 11 (1) to file electronically all paperwork required 12 by the agencies of the Department of Agriculture spec-13 ified in subsection (b): and 14 (2) to have access electronically to information, 15 readily available to the public in published form, re-16 garding farm programs, quarterly trade, economic, 17 and production reports, price and supply informa-18 tion, and other similar information related to produc-19 tion agriculture. 20 (b) Covered Agencies.—Subsection (a) shall apply 21 to the following agencies of the Department of Agriculture: 22 (1) The Farm Service Agency. 23 (2) The Risk Management Agency. (3) The Natural Resources Conservation Service. 24

7	(c) Time-Table for Implementation.—Not later
8	than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
9	the Secretary shall—
10	(1) to the maximum extent practicable, complete
11	the establishment of the electronic filing and retrieval
12	system required by subsection (a) to the extent nec-
13	essary to permit the electronic information access re-
14	quired by paragraph (2) of such subsection;
15	(2) initiate implementation of the electronic fil-
16	ing required by paragraph (1) of such subsection by
17	allowing farmers and other persons to download
18	forms from the Internet and submit completed forms
19	via facsimile, mail, or related means; and
20	(3) modify forms used by the agencies specified
21	in subsection (b) into a more user-friendly format,
22	with self-help guidance materials.
23	(d) Interoperability.—In carrying out this section,
24	the Secretary shall ensure that the agencies specified in sub-
25	section (b)—

1	(1) use computer hardware and software that is
2	compatible among the agencies and will operate in a
3	common computing environment; and
4	(2) develop common Internet user-interface loca-
5	tions and applications to consolidate the agencies
6	news, information, and program materials.
7	(e) Completion of Implementation.—Not later
8	than two years after the date of the enactment of this Act,
9	the Secretary shall complete the establishment of the elec-
10	tronic filing and retrieval system required by subsection (a)
11	to permit the electronic filing required by paragraph (1)
12	of such subsection.
13	(f) Progress Report.—Not later than 180 days after
14	the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall
15	submit to Congress a report describing the progress made
16	toward establishing the electronic filing and retrieval sys-
17	tem required by subsection (a).
18	SEC. 3. AVAILABILITY OF AGENCY INFORMATION TECH-
19	NOLOGY FUNDS.
20	(a) Reservation of Funds.—From funds made
21	available for each agency of the Department of Agriculture
22	specified in section 2(b) for information technology or infor-
23	mation resource management, the Secretary of Agriculture
24	shall reserve an amount equal to not more than the fol-

25 lowing:

- 1 (1) For fiscal year 2001, \$3,000,000.
- 2 (2) For each subsequent fiscal year, \$2,000,000.
- 3 (b) Time for Reservation.—The Secretary shall no-
- 4 tify Congress of the amount to be reserved under subsection
- 5 (a) for a fiscal year not later than December 1 of that fiscal
- 6 year.
- 7 (c) Use of Funds.—Funds reserved under subsection
- 8 (a) shall be used to establish the electronic filing and re-
- 9 trieval system required by section 2(a). Once the system is
- 10 established and operational, reserved amounts shall be used
- 11 for maintenance and improvement of the system.
- 12 (d) Return of Funds.—Funds reserved under sub-
- 13 section (a) and unobligated at the end of the fiscal year
- 14 shall be returned to the agency from which the funds were
- 15 reserved, and such funds shall remain available until ex-
- 16 pended.

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to require the Secretary of Agriculture to establish an electronic filing and retrieval system to enable farmers and other persons to file paperwork electronically with selected agencies of the Department of Agriculture and to access public information regarding the programs administered by these agencies.".
