A BILL

 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. PAY OF MEMBERS OF CONGRESS AND THE
4 PRESIDENT DURING GOVERNMENT SHUT5 DOWNS.

6 (a) COMPARABLE PAY TREATMENT FOR MEMBERS
7 OF CONGRESS.—The basic pay of Members of Congress

shall be treated in the same manner as the basic pay of
 the most adversely affected Federal employees who are not
 compensated for any period in which—

4 (1) there is more than a 24-hour lapse in appropria5 tions for any Federal agency or department as a result
6 of a failure to enact a regular appropriations bill or con7 tinuing resolution; or

8 (2) the Federal Government is unable to make pay9 ments or meet obligations because the public debt limit
10 under section 3101 of title 31, United States Code, has
11 been reached.

(b) AUTHORITY TO PROMULGATE REGULATIONS.—
The Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Administrative
Officer of the House of Representatives shall promulgate
any regulations needed to implement this section in a
manner consistent with the Constitution of the United
States.

(c) COMPARABLE PAY TREATMENT FOR THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.—The basic pay of the
President of the United States shall be treated in the same
manner as the pay of Members of Congress described in
subsection (a).

(d) SEVERABILITY.—If any provision of this section
 is held invalid by any Federal court, the remaining provi sions shall remain valid.

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
