Mr. BLAGOJEVICH (for himself and Mr. KENNEDY of Rhode Island) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To prohibit internet and mail-order sales of ammunition without a license to deal in firearms, and require licensed firearms dealers to record all sales of 1,000 rounds of ammunition to a single person.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. BAN ON INTERNET OR MAIL-ORDER SALE OF**
4 **AMMUNITION WITHOUT A FEDERAL LICENSE**
5 **TO DEAL IN FIREARMS.**

6 Section 922(a)(1) of title 18, United States Code, is
7 amended—

1 (1) by striking “or” at the end of subparagraph
2 (A);

3 (2) by adding “or” at the end of subparagraph
4 (B); and

5 (3) by adding at the end the following:

6 “(C) except a licensed dealer, to ship or
7 transport ammunition in interstate or foreign
8 commerce;”.

9 **SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT TO RECORD SALES OF MORE THAN**
10 **1,000 ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION.**

11 Section 923(g)(3)(A) of title 18, United States Code,
12 is amended by inserting after the 1st sentence the follow-
13 ing: “Each licensee shall prepare a report of multiple sales
14 or other dispositions whenever the licensee sells or other-
15 wise disposes of 1,000 or more rounds of ammunition
16 (other than .22 caliber rimfire ammunition, shotgun
17 shells, or primers) to the same person during 1 business
18 day.”.

19 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

20 The amendments made by this Act shall apply to con-
21 duct engaged in after the 1-year period that begins with
22 the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
