Mr. Ryan of Wisconsin submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform

## RESOLUTION

- Acknowledging the dedication and sacrifice made by the men and women who have lost their lives while serving as firefighters.
- Whereas there are over 1.1 million career and volunteer firefighters on active duty in the United States;
- Whereas over the past 10 years, 1,109 firefighters have lost their lives while fulfilling their commitment of saving the lives of others;
- Whereas each year fire departments throughout the United States receive calls to over 2 million fires, and over 8 million medical emergencies;
- Whereas the sacrifices of firefighters often go unrecognized;
- Whereas each year fire kills more Americans than all natural disasters combined;

- Whereas the National Fire Protection Association recently announced that 91 firefighters died on duty nationwide in 1998;
- Whereas 807,000 volunteer firefighters risk their lives without compensation; and
- Whereas the contributions of the firefighters and their families should be recognized: Now, therefore, be it
  - 1 Resolved, That it is the sense of the House of Rep-
  - 2 resentatives that—
  - 3 (1) all firefighters who risk their lives and die
  - 4 in the line of duty should be honored and recog-
  - 5 nized; and
  - 6 (2) the President should issue a proclamation
  - 7 calling upon the people of the United States to
  - 8 honor and recognize fallen firefighters with appro-
  - 9 priate ceremonies and respect.
