Commending and congratulating the United States Women's National Soccer Team for winning the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournament.

RESOLUTION

- Commending and congratulating the United States Women's National Soccer Team for winning the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournament.
- Whereas the third annual Women's World Cup of soccer was hosted by the United States;
- Whereas the 1999 Women's World Cup was the largest women's soccer world championship in history;
- Whereas 16 nations participated in the 1999 Women's World Cup, signaling a growth for women's soccer throughout the world;
- Whereas 31 matches were played before more than 650,000 fans in seven cities across the United States, with four matches drawing crowds of more than 65,000;

- Whereas the United States Women's National Soccer Team has a record of accomplishment, having won the first-ever 1991 Women's World Cup and the 1996 Olympics, and placing third in the 1996 Women's World Cup;
- Whereas the United States Women's National Soccer Team is noted for its over-arching commitment to teamwork, and is known in international competition for its devotion to sportsmanship and fair play;
- Whereas the 1999 Women's World Cup of soccer symbolizes an emerging role for young American women in sports and society;
- Whereas the 1999 Women's World Cup of soccer speaks to parents about the importance of athletic participation for building the character and confidence of their daughters;
- Whereas the United States has produced the best women's soccer team in the world, without a full-time professional women's league, relying instead on college soccer programs to provide a competitive environment for players;
- Whereas title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 has played a valuable role in strengthening women's college sports programs, creating opportunities for women to participate and compete at an advanced level in soccer and many other sports;
- Whereas over 90,000 fans attended the championship final between the United States and China, which is a record for a women-only sporting event; and
- Whereas the United States women's soccer team defeated China on July 10, 1999, with a 5 to 4 penalty kick victory: Now, therefore, be it
