RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 290) establishing the congressional budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2001, revising the congressional budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2000, and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels for each of fiscal years 2002 through 2005.

Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this
 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-1 ation of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 290) es-2 3 tablishing the congressional budget for the United States 4 Government for fiscal year 2001, revising the congres-5 sional budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2000, and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels 6 7 for each of fiscal years 2002 through 2005. The first read-8 ing of the concurrent resolution shall be dispensed with. 9 Points of order against consideration of the concurrent 10 resolution for failure to comply with clause 4(a) of rule XIII are waived. General debate shall not exceed three 11 hours, with two hours of general debate confined to the 12 13 congressional budget equally divided and controlled by the 14 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee 15 on the Budget, and one hour of general debate on the subject of economic goals and policies equally divided and con-16 trolled by Representative Saxton of New Jersey and Rep-17 18 resentative Stark of California or their designees. After 19 general debate the concurrent resolution shall be consid-20 ered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall 21 be in order to consider as an original concurrent resolution 22 for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule 23 the amendment in the nature of a substitute printed in 24 part A of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-25 panying this resolution. That amendment in the nature

of a substitute shall be considered as read. All points of 1 2 order against that amendment in the nature of a sub-3 stitute are waived. No amendment to that amendment in 4 the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those 5 printed in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules. Each amendment may be offered only in the order printed 6 7 in the report, may be offered only by a Member designated 8 in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debat-9 able for the time specified in the report equally divided 10 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to amendment. All points of order 11 12 against the amendment printed in part B of the report 13 are waived except that the adoption of an amendment in the nature of a substitute shall constitute the conclusion 14 15 of consideration of amendments to the amendment in the nature of a substitute made in order as original text. After 16 the conclusion of consideration of the concurrent resolu-17 tion for amendment and a final period of general debate, 18 19 which shall not exceed 10 minutes equally divided and con-20 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of 21 the Committee on the Budget, the Committee shall rise 22 and report the concurrent resolution to the House with 23 such amendment as may have been adopted. Any Member 24 may demand a separate vote in the House on any amend-25 ment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the con-

1 current resolution or to the amendment in the nature of 2 a substitute made in order as original text. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the concurrent 3 4 resolution and amendments thereto to final adoption with-5 out intervening motion except amendments offered by the chairman of the Committee on the Budget pursuant to 6 7 section 305(a)(5) of the Congressional Budget Act of 8 1974 to achieve mathematical consistency. The concurrent resolution shall not be subject to a demand for division 9 of the question of its adoption. 10

SEC. 2. Rule XXIII shall not apply with respect to
the adoption by the Congress of a concurrent resolution
on the budget for fiscal year 2001.
