## A BILL

To amend title 36, United States Code, to designate the day before Thanksgiving as "National Day of Reconciliation".

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. NATIONAL DAY OF RECONCILIATION.
- 4 (a) Findings.—Congress makes the following find-
- 5 ings:
- 6 (1) Alienation from God and from one another
- 7 is the greatest problem that faces this Nation.
- 8 (2) A house divided cannot long stand.

- 1 (b) NATIONAL DAY OF RECONCILIATION.—Chapter
- 2 1 of part A of subtitle I of title 36, United States Code,
- 3 is amended by adding at the end the following:

## 4 "§ 144. National Day of Reconciliation.

- 5 "The President shall issue each year a proclamation
- 6 designating the day before Thanksgiving as the National
- 7 Day of Reconciliation on which all persons in the United
- 8 States should seek out those persons who have been alien-
- 9 ated and pursue forgiveness and reconciliation."
- 10 (c) Table of Contents.—The table of contents in
- 11 chapter 1 of part A of subtitle I of title 36, United States
- 12 Code, is amended by inserting after the item relating to
- 13 section 143 the following new item:

"144. National Day of Reconciliation.".
