A BILL

To offset the spending contained in the fiscal year 1999 emergency supplemental appropriations bill in order to protect the surpluses of the social security trust funds.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. OFFSET OF EMERGENCY SUPPLEMENTAL**
4 **SPENDING.**

5 Not later than 15 days after Congress adjourns to
6 end the first session of the 106th Congress and on the
7 same day as a sequestration (if any) under sections 251

1 and 252 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit
2 Control Act of 1985, the Director of the Office of Manage-
3 ment and Budget shall cause, in the same manner pre-
4 scribed for section 251 of that Act, a sequestration for
5 fiscal year 2000 of all non-exempt accounts within the dis-
6 cretionary spending category (excluding function 050 (na-
7 tional defense)) to achieve a reduction in budget authority
8 equal to \$13,303,000,000 minus the dollar amount of re-
9 imbursements identified in the report required by section
10 2005 (efforts to increase burden-sharing) of the 1999
11 Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act.
