## A BILL

To amend the Poultry Products Inspection Act to cover birds of the order Ratitae that are raised for use as human food.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

## 3 SECTION 1. EXPANSION OF DEFINITION OF POULTRY TO 4 INCLUDE RATITES.

5 (a) DEFINITION OF POULTRY.—Section 4(e) of the 6 Poultry Products Inspection Act (21 U.S.C. 453(e)) is 7 amended by adding at the end the following: "The term 8 'poultry' includes birds of the order Ratitae, such as os-9 triches, emus, and rheas, that are raised for distribution 10 in commerce as human food.".

1 (b) IMPLEMENTATION OF AMENDMENT.—Beginning on the date that is 180 days after the date of enactment 2 of this Act, an establishment in the United States that 3 4 slaughters or processes birds of the order Ratitae for dis-5 tribution in commerce as human food shall be subject to 6 the ante mortem and post mortem inspection, reinspection, and sanitation requirements of the Poultry Products 7 Inspection Act (21 U.S.C. 451 et seq.) rather than the 8 voluntary poultry inspection program of the Department 9 of Agriculture established under section 203 of the Agri-10 cultural Marketing Act of 1946 (7 U.S.C. 1622). 11
