SEC. 2. REPEAL OF LIMITATION ON RECEIPTS ATTRIB-
UTABLE TO MILITARY PROPERTY WHICH MAY
BE TREATED AS EXEMPT FOREIGN TRADE IN-
COME.
(a) In General.—Subsection (a) of section 923 of
the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (defining exempt for-
eign trade income) is amended by striking paragraph (5)
and by redesignating paragraph (6) as paragraph (5).
(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
subsection (a) shall apply to taxable years beginning after
the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
