- 6 (a) In General.—During fiscal year 2000 and each
- 7 fiscal year thereafter, notwithstanding any law that au-
- 8 thorizes any officer or employee of the Department of the
- 9 Interior to enter private land for the purpose of con-
- 10 ducting an inspection or search and seizure for the pur-

1	pose of enforcing the law, any such officer or employee
2	shall not enter any private land without first obtaining—
3	(1) a warrant issued by a court of competent
4	jurisdiction; or
5	(2) the consent of the owner of the land.
6	(b) VIOLATION AND EMERGENCY EXCEPTION.—An
7	officer or employee of the Department of the Interior may
8	enter private land without meeting the conditions de-
9	scribed in subsection (a)—
10	(1) for the purpose of enforcing the law, if the
11	officer or employee has reason to believe that a vio-
12	lation of law is being committed; or
13	(2) as required as part of an emergency re-
14	sponse being conducted by the Department of the
15	Interior.
