A BILL

- To develop and apply a Consumer Price Index that accurately reflects the cost-of-living for older Americans who receive social security benefits under title II of the Social Security Act.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fair Cost of Living
 - 5 Adjustment for Seniors Act of 1999".

1	SEC. 2. IMPROVEMENT OF CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR
2	THE ELDERLY BY CONGRESSIONALLY AP-
3	POINTED REVIEW COMMITTEE.
4	(a) Establishment of Consumer Price Index
5	REVIEW COMMITTEE.—
6	(1) Establishment.—There is established a
7	review committee to be known as the Consumer
8	Price Index Review Committee (in this section re-
9	ferred to as the "Committee").
10	(2) Membership.—The Committee shall be
11	composed of 15 members jointly appointed by the
12	leadership of the Senate and the House of Rep-
13	resentatives of whom—
14	(A) 11 shall be leading experts in the field
15	of economics and, to the extent feasible, famil-
16	iar with the issues related to the calculation of
17	changes in the cost of living; and
18	(B) 4 shall be representatives of individ-
19	uals who have attained age 65.
20	(3) Terms and vacancies.—
21	(A) Terms.—A member of the Committee
22	appointed under paragraph (2) shall be ap-
23	pointed for the duration of the Committee.
24	(B) Vacancies.—
25	(i) IN GENERAL.—A vacancy on the
26	Committee shall be filled in the same man-

1	ner in which the original appointment was
2	made and shall be subject to any condi-
3	tions which applied with respect to the
4	original appointment.
5	(ii) Filling unexpired term.—An
6	individual chosen to fill a vacancy shall be
7	appointed for the duration of the Com-
8	mittee.
9	(4) Initial meeting.—Not later than 30 days
10	after the date on which all members of the Com-
11	mittee have been appointed, the Committee shall
12	hold its first meeting.
13	(5) Quorum.—A majority of the members of
14	the Committee shall constitute a quorum, but a less-
15	er number of members may hold hearings.
16	(6) Chairperson and vice chairperson.—
17	The Committee shall select a Chairperson and Vice
18	Chairperson from among the members appointed
19	under paragraph (2).
20	(b) Duties.—
21	(1) Study and development of implemen-
22	TATION PLAN.—
23	(A) IN GENERAL.—The Committee shall
24	conduct a study—

1	(i) to improve the method for deter-
2	mining an index, to be known as the "Con-
3	sumer Price Index for the Elderly";
4	(ii) to make recommendations ad-
5	dressing the limitations of the method for
6	determining the Experimental Consumer
7	Price Index for the Elderly calculated by
8	the Bureau of Labor Statistics to ensure
9	that the improved index accurately meas-
10	ures changes over time in expenditures for
11	consumption that are typical for retirees in
12	the United States who receive old-age and
13	survivors insurance benefits under title II
14	of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 401
15	et seq.); and
16	(iii) to develop an implementation
17	plan.
18	(B) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The study
19	described in subparagraph (A) shall include the
20	following requirements:
21	(i) The Consumer Price Index for the
22	Elderly shall be based on an accurate mar-
23	ket basket of goods and services that re-
24	flect a representative collection of typical
25	purchases by the total retiree population in

1	the United States who receive old-age and
2	survivors insurance benefits under title II
3	of such Act.
4	(ii) The Consumer Expenditure Sur-
5	vey used by the Bureau of Labor Statistics
6	to calculate the Experimental Consumer
7	Price Index for the Elderly shall be re-de-
8	signed and expanded to collect expenditure
9	patterns representative of such total retiree
10	population.
11	(iii) The areas and outlets priced by
12	the Bureau of Labor Statistics to calculate
13	the Experimental Consumer Price Index
14	for the Elderly shall be modified to reflect
15	a representation of the places of purchase
16	for such total retiree population.
17	(iv) The categories of items to be
18	priced shall be selected to represent such
19	total retiree population.
20	(v) The prices collected shall ade-
21	quately reflect the availability of discount
22	prices for such total retiree population.
23	(vi) Any other limitations otherwise
24	found to affect the accuracy of the Con-

1	sumer Price Index for the Elderly shall be
2	removed.
3	(C) Additional study.—The Committee
4	shall also study the method for determining an
5	accurate consumer price index for individuals
6	who receive disability insurance benefits under
7	title II of such Act.
8	(2) Report.—
9	(A) In general.—Subject to subpara-
10	graph (B), not later than 1 year after the ini-
11	tial meeting of the Committee under subsection
12	(a)(4), the Committee shall submit a report to
13	Congress on the study conducted in accordance
14	with paragraph (1).
15	(B) REQUIRED APPROVAL.—The Com-
16	mittee shall not submit a report under subpara-
17	graph (A) unless the report has the approval of
18	at least 9 members of the Committee.
19	(c) Powers.—
20	(1) Hearings.—The Committee may hold such
21	hearings, sit and act at such times and places, take
22	such testimony, and receive such evidence as the

Committee considers advisable to carry out the pur-

poses of this section.

23

- (2) Information from federal agencies.— The Committee may secure directly from any Fed-eral department or agency such information as the Committee considers necessary to carry out this sec-tion, including the published and unpublished data and analytical products of the Bureau of Labor Sta-tistics. Upon request of the Chairperson of the Com-mittee, the head of such department or agency shall furnish such information to the Committee in a timely manner.
 - (3) Postal services.—The Committee may use the United States mails in the same manner and under the same conditions as other departments and agencies of the Federal Government.
 - (4) GIFTS.—The Committee may accept, use, and dispose of gifts or donations of services or property.

(d) Personnel Matters.—

(1) Compensation of Members.—Each member of the Committee who is not otherwise an officer or employee of the Federal Government shall be compensated at a rate equal to the daily equivalent of the annual rate of basic pay prescribed for level III of the Executive Schedule under section 5315 of title 5, United States Code, for each day (including

travel time) during which such member is engaged in the performance of the duties of the Committee.

All members of the Committee who otherwise are officers or employees of the United States shall serve without compensation in addition to that received for their services as officers or employees of the United States.

(2) Travel expenses.—The members of the Committee shall be allowed travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates authorized for employees of agencies under subchapter I of chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code, while away from their homes or regular places of business in the performance of services for the Committee.

(3) Staff.—

- (A) In General.—The Chairperson of the Committee may, without regard to the civil service laws and regulations, appoint and terminate an executive director and such other additional personnel as may be necessary to enable the Committee to perform its duties. The employment of an executive director shall be subject to confirmation by the Committee.
- (B) Compensation.—The Chairperson of the Committee may fix the compensation of the

1 executive director and other personnel without 2 regard to the provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53 of title 5, United 3 States Code, relating to classification of positions and General Schedule pay rates, except 6 that the rate of pay for the executive director 7 and other personnel may not exceed the rate 8 payable for level IV of the Executive Schedule 9 under section 5316 of such title.

- (4) Detail of government employees.—
 Any Federal Government employee may be detailed to the Committee without additional reimbursement (other than the employee's regular compensation), and such detail shall be without interruption or loss of civil service status or privilege.
- (5) PROCUREMENT OF TEMPORARY AND INTER-MITTENT SERVICES.—The Chairperson of the Committee may procure temporary and intermittent services under section 3109(b) of title 5, United States Code, at rates for individuals which do not exceed the daily equivalent of the annual rate of basic pay prescribed for level V of the Executive Schedule under section 5316 of such title.

20	graph (B), not later than the fourth year that
21	begins after the Consumer Price Index Review
22	Committee submits the report required under
23	section 2(b)(2), the Commissioner of the Bu-
24	reau of Labor Statistics shall prepare and pub-
25	lish monthly the Official Consumer Price Index

3	(B) No implementation if congres-
4	SIONAL DISAPPROVAL OF COMMITTEE RE-

15	(B) Referral.—A resolution described in
16	subparagraph (A) that is introduced—
17	(i) in the House of Representatives,
18	shall be referred to the Committee on
19	Ways and Means; and
20	(ii) in the Senate, shall be referred to
21	the Committee on Finance.
22	(C) DISCHARGE.—If a committee to which
23	a resolution described in subparagraph (A) is
24	referred has not reported such resolution by the
25	end of the 60-day period beginning on the date

on which the Consumer Price Index Review
Committee submits the report required under
section 2(b)(2), such committee shall be, at the
end of such period, discharged from further
consideration of such resolution, and such resolution shall be placed on the appropriate calendar of the House involved.

- (D) Consideration.—On or after the third day after the date on which the committee to which a resolution described in subparagraph (A) has reported, or has been discharged from further consideration of such resolution, such resolution shall be considered in the same manner as a resolution is considered under subsections (d), (e), and (f) of section 2908 of the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1990 (10 U.S.C. 2687 note).
- (b) Use of Index.—For cost-of-living computation quarters (as defined in section 215(i)(1)(B) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 415(i)(1)(B))) beginning on or after January 1 of the calendar year that begins after the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor Statistics first prepares and publishes the Official Consumer Price Index for the Elderly in accordance with subsection (a)(1), the Commissioner of Social Security shall—

1	(1) cease using the Consumer Price Index for
2	All Urban Consumers to calculate cost-of-living ad-
3	justments for old-age and survivors insurance bene-
