A BILL

To direct the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration to issue regulations to limit the number of pieces of carry-on baggage that a passenger may bring on an airplane.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CARRY-ON BAGGAGE.
- 4 (a) Definitions.—In this Act:
- 5 (1) AIRPLANE.—The term "airplane" means an
- 6 airplane, as that term is used in section 121.589 of
- 7 title 14, Code of Federal Regulations.

- 1 (2) CARRY-ON BAGGAGE.—The term "carry-on baggage" does not include child safety seats or assistive devices used by disabled passengers.
- 4 (3) CERTIFICATE HOLDER.—The term "certifi-5 cate holder" means a certificate holder, as that term 6 is used in section 121.589 of title 14, Code of Fed-7 eral Regulations.
- 8 (4) Passenger.—The term "passenger" in-9 cludes any child under the age of 2 who boards an 10 airplane of a certificate holder, without regard to 11 whether a ticket for air transportation was pur-12 chased for the child.
- 13 (b) Regulations.—Not later than 6 months after
 14 the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of
 15 the Federal Aviation Administration shall promulgate re16 vised regulations to modify the regulations contained in
 17 section 121.589 of title 14, Code of Federal Regulations,
 18 to require that each certificate holder include in the certifi19 cate holder's carry-on baggage program the following re20 quirements:
- 21 (1) Each passenger boarding an airplane of the 22 certificate holder shall be limited to a total of 2 23 pieces of carry-on baggage.

1 (2) The sum of each dimension of the carry-on 2 baggage referred to in paragraph (1) shall not ex-3 ceed 9 inches by 14 inches by 22 inches.
